









After the success of the Tahiti Pearl Regatta in the Leeward Islands, the Windward Islands took the challenge and managed to gather an even larger fleet on the water to celebrate the 12th anniversary of the Tahiti Moorea Sailing rendezvous. Just as in 2016 we are execting almost 60 sailboats and 200 people from a dozen different countries (USA, Canada, NZ, Singapore, UK, France, Germany, Australia, etc.) who will gather for three days of festivities: June 23 in Papeete, and June 24 and 25 in Moorea.

3 days of festivities, letting these crews of «tourists» feel welcome in an event combining sailing, traditional sports and intercultural encounters. Its mission is to make it possible for our exploring visitors to discover, as part of a friendship rally, the charm of our islands, the joy of living of their inhabitants and their rich culture.

The Tahiti Moorea Sailing rendezvous is organized in synergy by the City of Papeete, Tahiti Tourism, the Commune of Moorea- Maiao, and several private partners in Tahiti (Air Tahiti Nui, the Port of Papeete, Pacific Sud Yacht, Sin Tung Hing Marine, Tahiti Crew, Eco Car Tahiti, Les 3 Brasseurs, Aremiti Ferry, le Yacht Club de Tahiti) but also international partners (Latitude 38 USA, Whangarei Marine Group NZ, Bay of Islands Marina NZ, Port Whangarei Marine Center NZ, Vuda Marina Fidji). They join forces in order to offer to these boaters this weekend of festivities: the Tahiti-Moorea Sailing Rendez-Vous

Historical Context

Every year, between May and August, nearly 700 yachts and super yachts cross the Pacific Ocean and stop in our lagoons. Their greatest number is In June as the season favors downwinds, and the Heiva festivities also attract those boaters.

In 2006, Stephanie BETZ met Andy Turpin, the chief editor of the *Latitude 38* magazine, a reference for all American sailors who sail around the world. His magazine brings many boaters to his network and organizes an annual informal transpacific rally called the "Puddle Jump" to accompany these boaters who engage in the great Pacific.



These boaters arriving by sea do not receive a Polynesian welcome like at Fa'aa Airport. Therefore, Archipelagoes imagined a hospitality day, a rendezvous given to them at the highlight of the season. Accompanied by the Tahiti Tourisme and Air Tahiti Nui, the adventure began in 2006. Together they set up the first edition of the *Tahiti Tourism Cup*.

The first Hospitality Day for nautical tourists took place on July 1st 2006 in the lagoon of Raiatea and Taha'a, it gathered 19 sailboats and more than 100 people. Encouraged by its success and the enthusiasm of the participants, the Tahiti Tourisme and its partners reiterated the program every year.





Since the Leeward Islands already had their flagship event with the Tahiti Pearl Regatta, it was decided to maintain this welcome to nautical tourists, but in the Windward Islands, between Tahiti and Moorea, over 3 days, to rename it the "Tahiti Moorea Sailing Rendezvous" or "TMS"

For 2 years, the Tahiti Moorea Sailing rallied Tahiti to Vairao Bay, on Temae beach, then to Opunohu Bay for 3 consecutive years on Mareto beach. Starting 3 years ago, the Moorea festivities are taking place in the gardens and on the beach of *Club Bali Hai* in Cook's Bay, with the active support of the Municipality of Moorea.

In 2016, more than 60 sailboats were enrolled, 200 international boaters who benefited from this welcome, these days of sharing culture, traditional sports, our food, our frenzied dancing and ukulele music.



The idea :

Hosted by a skippers' briefing, a sailing rally and an introduction to V6 canoes, these days are designed to welcome and create a meeting place between the international crews during their stopover in Polynesia, the sailors of the islands, the locals and yachting professionals, tourism (activities, hotels, restaurants, etc.).

Indeed, these boaters, often 2 or 3 aboard, invite the public to embark on their sailboat, and share a day of sailing with them.

And so, every year about thirty residents participate to this welcome.

A synergy of players about sailing:

First, the *commune of Papeete* and its municipal council, which work to develop the impact of yachting in the city, and its determination to develop the positioning of Papeete as a renown port city, is a major player in these welcoming days for boaters.

Tahiti Tourisme, the initiator of these days, opens its gardens, provides the support of its teams to the logistics and advertising, and helps to keep alive the «Sailors friendly» reputation of our destination.

The Autonomous Port of Papeete, through its investment in the new Marina, offers to our boaters a quality docking in a comfortable environment





The Municipality of Moorea, the sister island, which is developing new welcoming infrastructures, while protecting its lagoon and its municipal team, which deploys each year a lot of energy to support this rendezvous.

Air Tahiti Nui, our faithful partner for 11 years, which lets us bring the Latitude 38 magazine to cover the event, and support the travel of our overseas partners and also the kind support of *Pacific Sud Yacht*, Sin Tung Hing Marine, Tahiti Crew, Eco Car Tahiti, Les 3 Brasseurs, Aremiti Ferry, le Yacht Club de Tahiti

During the TMS, the skippers will also be invited to respond to the boating qualitative survey implemented this year by *Tahiti Tourisme*. Analysis of these questionnaires and the qualitative data collected will provide the decision tools for the promotion and development plans for nautical tourism activities.

A good time to raise awareness:

Supported by the PGEM committee, it will also be an opportunity to educate boaters about lagoon and environment protection. Boaters will be guided to Cook's Bay to choose their anchorage in accordance with the rules of the PGEM.

The promotion of traditional sports and sharing:

The Faaroa sports and cultural association, chaired by Jordan Temairia, sets up an initiation path. By teams, they must take part in a fruit carrier race, stone lifting and coconut grating.

The Te Firi Nape association of Maharepa will be responsible for the organization of the boaters' canoe racing. A briefing on the beach to quickly learn how to hold a paddle and know how to turn, then a start by teams in five V6, in front of *Club Bali Hai*, a 500-meter race, with some capsizing, all under the audience's applauses.









Papeete, a sailing hub in the Pacific
